



From the enchanting Aboriginal culture to the epic outback landscape, the Northern Territory is one of those special places that has the ability to completely capture your imagination. Get to know Aboriginal culture on a bush tucker tour. Go spear fishing, watch traditional Aboriginal dances and learn of the creation stories to get a true sense of Australia. It's all there waiting for you.

The Northern Territory is paradise for the nature traveller. With 52 national parks to explore, you'll see saltwater crocs, birds and wildlife around picturesque walking trails, swimming holes and camps. See something new everyday as you cross a landscape of harsh desert, mountain ranges and cattle stations. You never know what will be around the next corner.

Red Centre

Things are big in the Red Centre. Big rocks, big open space and big, beautiful starry skies. Some of Australia's most iconic sights are our big landmarks – Uluru with its more than 300 metre high surface and Kata Tjuta (The Olgas), massive piles of rock domes dating back 500 million years. The unique sights of Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park have great Aboriginal cultural significance and earn it a World Heritage Listing.

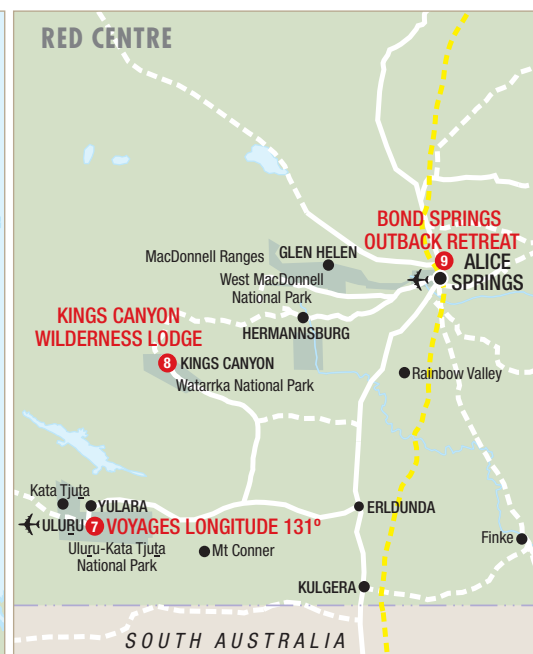
Just as awe-inspiring are the big chasms of the Northern Territory. At Watarrka National Park, take a walk around Kings Canyon. See native plants and wildlife among waterholes and gorges on a six kilometre round tour. In fact, the Territory's full of great walks. The 223 kilometre West MacDonnell Ranges' Larapinta Trail is a desert challenge for those with their hearts set on adventure.

Top End

The Top End is known for its rock art sites, nature and wildlife and you'll see it all on a visit to Kakadu National Park. Like the sight of huge numbers of water birds coming in for a drink and lush pockets of rainforest full of wildlife. Or the sight of a tropical sunset from the top of rock art gallery Ubirr.

You can't go to the Top End without an adventure through Arnhem Land. The huge expanse in the middle of Australia's northern coast is one of the country's most diverse landscapes, with everything from rugged coast to deserted islands, rivers, rainforests, escarpments and woodlands. Take a tour with a local guide or seek out some Aboriginal art. Marvel at the unspoilt beauty and ancient culture. At the end of the day, enjoy a cold drink and take in glorious views of the changing colours of the sunset.

A favourite pastime in the north is fishing, and rightly so. It's here you'll find lush billabongs, tidal rivers, mangrove-lined estuaries and unspoilt coastline that make fishing trips year-round excitement in the Northern Territory.

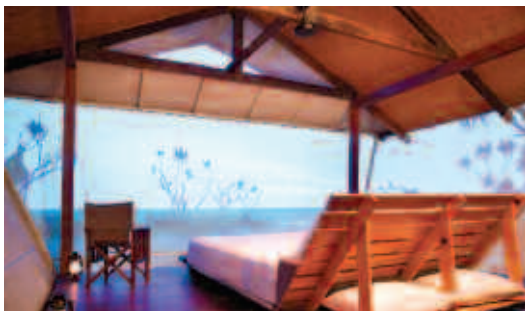

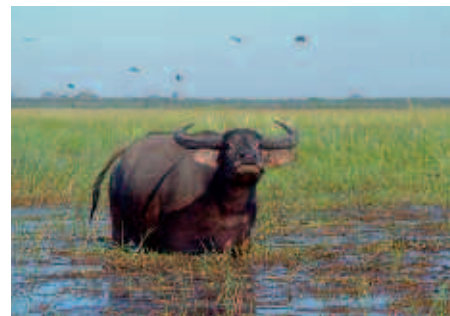

The landscape of Hawk Dreaming offers some of the best views of spectacular rocks and wetlands you're likely to see anywhere in Kakadu National Park.

With a capacity limited to just 24 guests at one time, the camp provides an intimate and personalised experience. 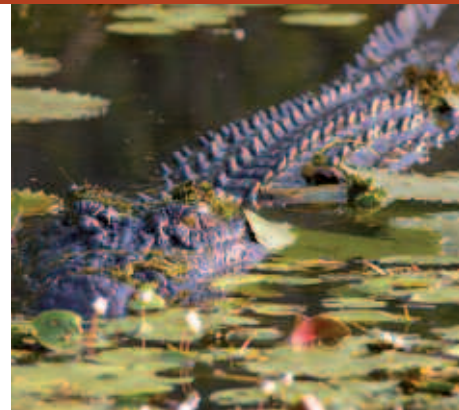

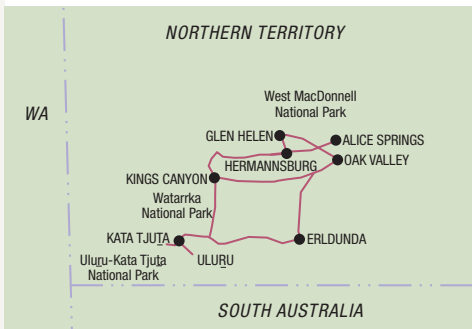

Day 1: Alice Springs to Uluru

Watch the sunrise over Uluru and Kata Tjuta and hike through the magnificent 'Valley of the Winds'. Travel to Curtin Springs Cattle Station before arriving at the overnight campsite at Kings Creek Station. (BLD)

Day 3: Kings Canyon to Oak Valley

Head to Watarrka (Kings Canyon) for a walk through the towering walls, crevices and plateaus. Visit the Amphitheatre, Lost City and take a swim in the Garden of Eden. Travel by 4WD to the Oak Valley Aboriginal Community for an evening joined by Aboriginal hosts. (BLD)

Day 4: Oak Valley and West MacDonnell Ranges

After a hearty breakfast, see the sights of Oak Valley and depart for the West MacDonnell Ranges. Stop at Ormiston Gorge to hike the Ghost Gum Walk and take



a swim in the beautiful surrounding rock pools. Continue to Glen Helen, our overnight bush camp under the stars. (BLD)

Day 5: West MacDonnell Ranges to Alice Springs

View Gosse Bluff (comet crater) on the way to Hermannsburg, a historic Lutheran mission. Visit the heritage precinct and explore the historic buildings and grounds. Drive to Palm Valley for a hike through this picturesque valley discovering some of its hidden treasures. Depart for Alice Springs, arriving early evening. (BL)

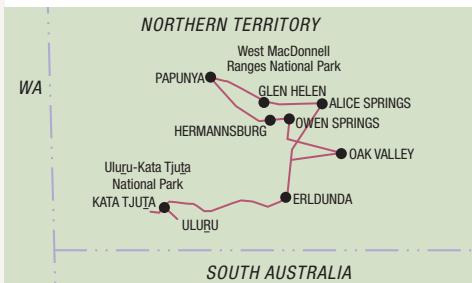

Day 1: Alice Springs to Glen Helen, Haasts Bluff and Papunya

Travel via the MacDonnell Ranges to Glen Helen Resort. Stroll to Glen Helen Gorge or peruse the collection of Ngurratjuta art and the history of Albert Namatjira. Continue to the communities of Haasts Bluff and Papunya, home to diverse art and fine artists. Papunya is also famous for musicians including The Walpiri Band and the location where Midnight Oil recorded an album. A bush camp will be chosen for the first evening under the stars. (LD)

Day 2: Hermannsburg and Owen Springs

After breakfast visit the Areyonga Community nestled within the scenic Krichauff and Razorback Ranges, bordered by the tribal lands of the Western Arrente and Pitjantjatjara Land. Travel to the oldest Lutheran based Aboriginal Community in Australia, Hermannsburg, a region rich with history and art. View the old Historical Precinct, the Namatjira Family Gallery, Hermannsburg potters, the ladies workshop and fine silk art. Continue to the campsite at Owen Springs Conservation Park. (BLD)

Day 3: Owen Springs to Oak Valley Community

Journey to the Titjikala Community, the land of the Southern Arrente clan, followed by the Oak Valley Aboriginal Community. Interact with artists; viewing artwork and artefacts. Tonight camp at the community, joined by Aboriginal hosts. Shower and toilet facilities are available. (BLD)



Day 4: Oak Valley to Uluru

Travel the famous Hugh River Stock Route to Erldunda and Mt Ebenezer, the art centre for the Imanpa Community – a cultural mix of Pitjantjatjara, Yankantjatjara and Luritja dialects. See diverse art by the young women and girls of the community. Continue to Curtin Springs Cattle Station and Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park to see artwork at the Cultural Centre, the Maruku Art Warehouse – the largest collection of Anangu art on display. Time permitting, enjoy a short Mala or Mutitjulu Walk at Uluru before watching an unforgettable Uluru sunset with a glass of wine. Overnight at a private bush camp. (BLD)

Day 5: Uluru to Alice Springs

Enjoy a base walk of Uluru and watch a spectacular sunrise, bringing together the stories of the Alcheringa (Dreamtime) and Tjukurpa (Laws and Creation). After a hearty breakfast journey back to Alice Springs. (BL)

Day 1: Alice Springs

On arrival at Simpsons Gap, a region synonymous with the Dreamtime (Alcheringa) of the Western Arrernte Aboriginal people, transfer to your overnight campsite location. (BLD)

Day 3: Serpentine Gorge and Serpentine Chalet Dam

Head to the spectacular western half of the Larapinta Trail. The 13.4 kilometre section of the trail offers exhilarating views of the high quartzite ridgelines that typify the West MacDonnell Ranges, including Haasts Bluff and Mount Zeil. (BLD)

Day 4: Ormiston Gorge and Glen Helen

Traverse the low lying regions surrounding Ormiston Gorge gradually working upward into the back reaches of the Finke River. Steeped in traditional folklore, see several important sites including 'Yalpulpa', part of Aboriginal legends. Camp by Mount Sonder (The Pregnant Lady) and the imagery of Yeperenye Hills (Caterpillar Dreaming). (BLD)



Day 5: Mount Sonder Climb

Challenge the eight kilometre climb to the peak of Mount Sonder. Enjoy a sunrise and 360 degree views – a truly unforgettable achievement. Enjoy time at camp for your last evening under the stars. (BLD)

Day 6: Ormiston Pound Walk and Alice Springs

The Ormiston Pound Walk is full of wow factor, wildlife and flora and a great finale to the walk. A location inspirational to Albert Namatjira, with sensational viewings of the Chewing's Range and Mount Giles. After lunch, break camp and return to Alice Springs. (BL)
