Karijini National Park

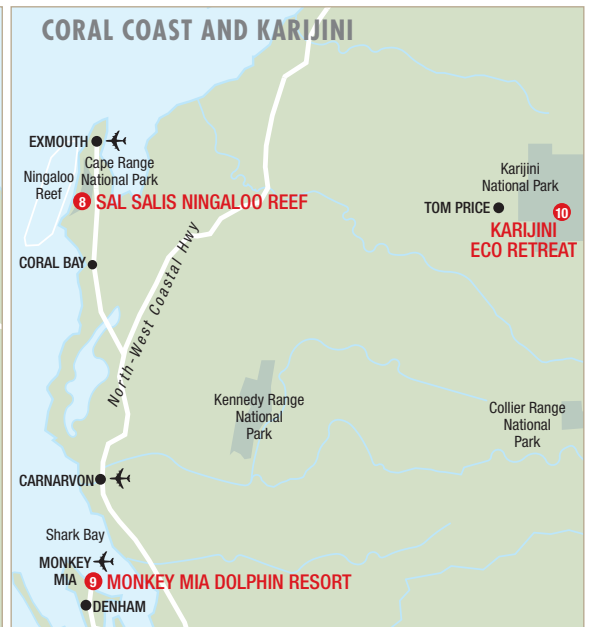
